
MESSAGES FROM STEGH HOSPITAL LEADERSHIP

Transforming Tomorrow Campaign.
This \$8 million campaign will allow
STEGH to enhance and expand its
entire Diagnostic Imaging
Department. This means
advancements in CT Scan, Nuclear
Medicine, X-Ray, Ultrasound, and
obtaining a brand new Magnetic
Resonance Imaging (MRI) machine.

The latest in MRI technology will deliver detailed images providing accurate diagnosis for everything from ligament and tendon injuries, joint injuries, tumours including cancer as well as brain and spinal cord injuries.

Emergency Department in the
southwest region, many patients who
come to STEGH will need Diagnostic
Imaging tests or procedures.





Without our own MRI, over 5,000 of these patients must travel outside our community for MRI scans each year.

- Supporting Patients with Vision Impairments: STEGH was the first hospital in the region to implement the Checkered Eye project in support of patients with low vision or vision impairments, enhancing accessibility and inclusivity.
- Land Acknowledgement: A Corporate Land Acknowledgement is proudly displayed at each hospital entrance, and staff were provided with a resource guide to develop their own personal Land Acknowledgements, recognizing and honouring the traditional territories of Indigenous peoples.






Total Revenue by Type

Donor Support for New Smart Beds

Last spring, George Foster, Manager Surgical Services, shared the importance of an often overlooked but essential piece of equipment, the hospital bed. George shared STEGH is seeing more medically complex patients, who may need to stay in hospital longer than expected before they can be safely discharged.

Generous donations from our community to the Foundation helped raise a remarkable \$156,753, which allowed the purchase of 10 Centrella Smart+ Beds for the inpatient floors, the Continuing Care Centre, and Integrated Stroke Unit.

These state of the art Smart Beds help prevent pressure injuries from developing, promote independence, and enhance comfort and support for patients in recovery. The value of these beds increases when patients are confined to their beds for an extended period.

Jason Keip, a recent patient, trialed one of these beds and shared "When you're admitted to the hospital, you don't know how long you're going to need to stay to get better. If you're going to be in the hospital for a longer stay, like I am, it's nice to be comfortable."

While Jason said all of the beds are quite comfortable, he noticed this particular bed provides a lot of information for his care team. For example, a sensor installed on the Centrella Smart + bed detects cardiac and respiratory motion. If the values get too high, the bed will alert staff.

The bed also provides easily understandable verbal safety prompts to caution staff and patients. For example, if a patient is moving towards the edge of the bed or exiting the bed, they may hear "please don't get up", which could help reduce fall risks.

Thank you to our donors for their generous support; their contributions not only help patients like Jason, they further our mission to partner with the community to support our hospital in the delivery of an excellent patient care experience.







Foundation Investment in STEGH Laboratory Program

The STEGH Foundation is proud to have invested \$800,000 into STEGH's Laboratory Program for the development of a brand new Pathology & Core Laboratory.

The Laboratory Program at STEGH provides a wide variety of Laboratory tests to meet the needs of Elgin County and beyond, from analyzing biopsies and specimen, to results from bloodwork, urine and stool. Our lab conducted over 1.76 million procedures last year alone.

Since 2022, partnership with the London Health Science Centre (LHSC) Pathology and Laboratory Medicine (PaLM) has allowed STEGH to leverage their highly skilled resources, receive clinical and technical support, and collectively seek new opportunities in innovation and system wide efficiencies.

Our Laboratory Program recently received Accreditation status in October of 2022. This means that not only do we follow best practice with each procedure, we also

meet the criteria for Quality, Competence, and Safety, as a Medical Laboratory and with our Point of Care testing devices set by Accreditation Canada.

The Laboratory Program at STEGH has been working with the Ministry of Health – Capital Branch since 2014 to secure funding and approval to bring this move to fruition, with the plan to relocate from STEGH's Main building to the North building.

Since then, hospital administration, STEGH Foundation, our community, donors and stakeholders, and staff have come together to turn this dream into a reality.

The new lab was built with a direct pneumatic tube system from the lab to the Operating Rooms, allowing for simpler sample transfer between departments, and proving a more efficient workflow for all laboratory staff.

This means clinicians will have faster access to information required to make decisions about patients.

The Pathology Laboratory completed their move to the new location over April 12 and 13, 2024, with the Core Laboratory having a projected move in over June 18 and 19, 2024.

Along with the move to a new location came the purchase of new crucial equipment; this includes three sets of analyzers for Hematology (used to count blood cells), Point of Care Testing (Gem 5000), and Chemistry (Vitros XT 7600, allowing for efficient, high-volume testing). This will ensure a continued ability to provide timely and accurate test results to support rapid diagnosis and treatment of STEGH patients.

"This new facility is in a modern building complying with the most current and highest standards in medical construction, with a well thought layout permitting a more efficient workflow and harbouring the most up to date technical equipment. It is also the new home for a vibrant group of highly motivated professionals putting the best of their expertise and passion at the service of our community."
